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what is the basis of belief in an era when globalization multiculturalism and big business are the new religion slavoj žižek renowned philosopher and irrepressible cultural critic takes on all comers in this compelling and breathless new book from cyberspace reason to the paradox that is western buddhism on belief gets behind the contours of the way we normally think about belief in particular judaism and christianity holding up the so called authenticity of religious belief to critical light žižek draws on psychoanalysis film and philosophy to reveal in startling fash

slavoj žižek s critical engagement with christian theology goes much further than his seminal the fragile absolute 2000 or his the puppet and the dwarf 2003 or even his discussion with noted theologian john milbank in the monstrosity of christ 2009 his reading of christianity utilising his signature elements of lacanian psychoanalysis and hegelian philosophy with modern philosophical currents can be seen as a genuinely original contribution to the philosophy of religion this book focuses on

these aspects of Žižek's thought with either philosophy and cultural theory or christian theology serving as starting points of enquiry written by a panel of international contributors each chapter teases out various strands of Žižek's thought concerning christianity and religion and brings them into a wider conversation about the nature of faith these essays show that far from being an outright rejection of christian thought and intellectual heritage Žižek's work could be seen as a perverse affirmation thereof thus what he has to say should be of direct interest to christian theology itself touching on thinkers such as badiou lacan chesterton and schelling this collection is a dynamic reading and re-reading of Žižek's relationship to christianity as such scholars of theology the philosophy of religion and Žižek more generally will all find this book to be of great interest

what is the future of continental philosophy of religion these forward looking essays address the new thinkers and movements that have gained prominence since the generation of derrida deleuze foucault and levinas and how they will reshape continental philosophy of religion in the years to come they look at the ways concepts such as liberation sovereignty and post colonialism have engaged this new generation with political theology and the new pathways of thought that have opened in the wake of speculative realism and recent findings in neuroscience and evolutionary psychology readers will discover new directions in this challenging and important area of philosophical inquiry

arguing that intellectual movements such as deconstruction postsecular theory and political theology have different implications for cultures and societies that live with the debilitating effects of past imperialisms arvind mandair unsettles the politics of knowledge construction in which the category of religion continues to be central through a case study of sikhism he launches an extended critique of religion as a cultural universal at the same time he presents a portrait of how certain aspects of sikh tradition were reinvented as religion during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries india's imperial elite subtly recast sikh tradition as a sui generis religion which robbed its teachings of their political force in turn sikhs began to define themselves as a nation and a world religion that was separate from but parallel to the rise of the indian state and global hinduism rather than investigate these processes in isolation from europe mandair shifts the focus closer to the political history of ideas thereby recovering part of europe's repressed colonial memory mandair rethinks the intersection of religion and the secular in discourses such as history of religions postcolonial theory and recent continental philosophy though seemingly unconnected these discourses are shown to be linked to a philosophy of generalized translation that emerged as a key conceptual matrix in the colonial encounter between india and the west in this riveting study mandair

demonstrates how this philosophy of translation continues to influence the repetitions of religion and identity politics in the lives of south asians and the way the academy state and media have analyzed such phenomena

religion and european philosophy key thinkers from kant to Žižek draws together a diverse group of scholars in theology religious studies and philosophy to discuss the role that religion plays among key figures in the european philosophical tradition designed for accessibility each of the thirty four chapters includes background information on the key thinker an overview of the main themes concepts and concerns that occupy his or her attention and a discussion of the religious and theological elements present in his or her thought in light of contemporary issues given the scope of the volume religion and european philosophy will be the go to guide for understanding the religious and theological dimensions of european philosophy for both students and established researchers alike

eric bain selbo argues that the study of religion from philosophers to psychologists and historians of religion to sociologists has separated out the ends or goals of religion and thus created the conditions by which institutional religion is increasingly irrelevant in contemporary western culture there is ample evidence that institutional religion is in trouble and little evidence that it will strengthen in the future giving some reason to believe that we are in the process of seeing the end of religion at the same time various cultural practices have met in the past and continue to meet today certain fundamental human needs needs that we might identify as religious that now are being fulfilled through what bain selbo calls the religion of culture the end s of religion traces the way that the very study of religion has led to institutional religion being viewed as just one human institution that can address our particular religious needs rather than the sole institution to do so in turn ultimately we can begin to see how other institutions or forms of culture can function to serve these same needs or ends

one of our most daring intellectuals offers a lacanian interpretation of religion finding that early christianity was the first revolutionary collective slavoj Žižek has been called an academic rock star and the wild man of theory his writing mixes astonishing erudition and references to pop culture in order to dissect current intellectual pieties in the puppet and the dwarf he offers a close reading of today s religious constellation from the viewpoint of lacanian psychoanalysis he critically confronts both predominant versions of today s spirituality new age gnosticism and deconstructionist levinasian judaism and then tries to redeem the materialist kernel of christianity his reading of christianity is explicitly political discerning in the pauline community of believers the first version of a revolutionary collective since today even advocates of enlightenment like jurgen habermas acknowledge that a religious vision is needed to ground our ethical and political stance in a postsecular age this

book with a stance that is clearly materialist and at the same time indebted to the core of the christian legacy is certain to stir controversy

ruf philosophy florida atlantic u and emeritus west virginia u explains to undergraduate students some of the ways philosophers have been trying to make sense of things over the past 150 years he analyzes criticizes selectively appropriates and reconstructs writings of existentialists social and cultural critics pragmatists and postmodernists in order to find a coherent interpretation of the current human form of life and its future possibilities

shaping belief explores how the energy of belief came to manifest itself in nineteenth century writing this manifestation was evident as much in expressions of newly formed personal relations to ideas as in the appropriation of religious discourse in writing of the period by re-visioning the place of belief in nineteenth century writing this collection provides important forays into current thinking both on the position occupied by belief within nineteenth century literary studies and within contemporary culture itself

in this critical examination of the role of the imagination in the modern and postmodern periods victor e taylor looks at the fable as a narrative form that addresses the ultimate questions of how to live and why he assesses various literary theories and styles in the wake of postmodernism to reveal the ways in which fable style narrative can be a meaningful genre for addressing traditional and post-traditional religious ethical and epistemological concerns in the process taylor draws on key figures across the humanities from mircea eliade and claude lévi strauss paul ricoeur and slavoj žizek to leo tolstoy and franz kafka placing an emphasis on rethinking the importance of critical theory in religious studies the author argues that a new more demanding formulation of the concept of possibility allows for a realignment of the philosophical mythological and literary imaginations by returning to the history of philosophy myth studies and modern literature taylor makes a renewed case for the significance of a distinctive formulation of religious theory as a desire for thinking religion after postmodernism calls for a reconsideration of theory as thinking for the future of philosophy religious studies and literature

actively engages love in the practice of philosophy

ideology draws on the social political and cultural theory of jurgen habermas gilles deleuze and slavoj žizek in order to explore the possibility of developing a critical conception of ideology the book is concerned with two main themes the relationship of ideology to the real and the relationship between ideology and the ethical although these three writers are often assumed to have little in common porter demonstrates a formal homology between them by showing that they all offer an idea of critique that pivots around two central intuitions firstly they insist that a substantive critical distinction can be drawn between the ideological and the real and secondly habermas deleuze and žizek all offer an image of ideology critique that is importantly grounded on ethical terms by engaging among other things with habermas's sociological work on the public sphere žizek's forays into popular culture and deleuze's analysis of political cinema ideology strives to concretely animate how each of these figures provide the critical tools necessary to challenge the kinds of ideological practice that pervade the contemporary social world

what is religion can it be defined at all or is it too easily defined in far too many ways so as to make a religion a drifting signifier or whatever one's pleasure is does the study of religion require special perhaps religious tools of analysis and explanation what is the difference between a knowledge of religion derived from practicing it and a knowledge about religion derived from nonreligious modes of inquiry sooner or later any serious student of religion must face these questions if religious practices are to be investigated in the light of the terms and aims of the social and human sciences in the modern university the guide to the study of religion provides a map of the key concepts and thought structures for imagining and studying religion as a class of everyday social practices that lend themselves to no more or less difficult explanation than any other class of social phenomena

the modernist controversy in the roman catholic church at the turn of the nineteenth century was a complex mixture of intellectual argument and personal relationships some of the individuals involved lost their faith while others deepened it this book is the result of a complex interplay of many scholars working together the essays examine the autobiographies of several important modernists they focus on the historical elements in which the individuals and the christian community were involved as well as provide normative evaluations of the modernists as christians and fallible human beings this careful and well documented scholarship sheds an unusually clear light on both the broad historical context and the individual protagonists

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
